# **COMPETITION GUIDELINES**

- (New) Teachers entering students must be a member of DMTA or TMEA. TMEA members
  will enroll students at the DMTA member fee and must email a copy of their current TMEA
  membership card to the Chairman by the registration deadline. Deadline for DMTA
  membership application is ON OR BEFORE October 1, 2017. Go to www.dallasmta.org
- ALL Teachers (DMTA and TMEA members) enrolling students in the competition are required to serve as monitor on the day of the contest in which their student(s) are registered. Substitute monitors are available for a fee and are listed on the website.
- Eligibility: Ages 4-18 (senior in high school). The age of the contestant on January 1, 2018 determines the division he or she may enter.
- Each student is allowed ONE entry in the competition. EXCEPTION: students entering the Piano Grand Prize Concerto category may also enter the Piano Unrestricted Repertoire Concerto category.
- The 1<sup>st</sup> place winner in the Piano Grand Prize Concerto division is ineligible to enter the Piano Unrestricted Repertoire division.
- 6. Contest pieces must be performed by memory.
- 7. Contestants must provide their own accompanist.
- Each contestant must provide music for the judge. Photocopies are not accepted for any reason.
- There will be NO finals for any category. Winners will receive their awards immediately
  following each division's competition. All 1<sup>st</sup> place winners in the Piano Discipline will
  perform during the awards ceremony for their division.
- 10. Audiences are invited to the awards ceremony and winner's performance.
- 11. The use of cameras or recording/video equipment is not permitted during any phase of the competition and could result in disqualification.
- 12. 1st place winners are NOT eligible to enter a division in which they have previously won.
- 13. ONE 1<sup>st</sup> place Senior Concerto Winner will be chosen from each Discipline (Piano, String, Wind, Voice) and this winner will perform with the orchestra. EXCEPTION: the 1<sup>st</sup> place winner of the Piano Senior Unrestricted Repertoire Concerto division WILL NOT perform with the orchestra.
- 14. There will be NO Junior Concerto winner to perform with the orchestra.
- 15. Judges' decisions are final and the judges reserve the right to declare 'No Winner.'
